/ PROJECT BACKGROUND

Beyond Opposition is a research project based in the school of geography in University College Dublin, investigating geographies of gender and sexuality in Ireland, Canada and Great Britain. We are creating an online multi-art exhibition in the form of a website that presents the outputs of three distinct collaborative arts-based research workshops held in 2023 in Dublin, Vancouver and Glasgow. The research project which leads to this exhibition is described in more detail in the complete project brief attached.

SCOPE

This project will involve creating a new standalone website to display an online multi-art exhibition, arising from three arts-based research workshops. It is not modelled on any existing template.

The website will have three project sub-sites, each representing a different art form (visual art; sound art; theatre/ comic art) in a different city (Dublin; Vancouver; Glasgow). The scope of the work will include web design, integration and navigation work,

The required skills include, but are not restricted to:

- Web Design
- Information Architecture

Task Specification

It is envisaged that this project will involve the following distinct steps: Project Initiation

- Site Structure
- Content requirements
- Art and graphic Design requirements

- Overall vision/ plan

Ongoing liaison to fine-tune the process and make adjustments as necessary.

Project Implementation

- Development of site design and navigation structure in agreement with project team
- Import of imagery/ sound art
- Testing (QA/user-testing/compliance with Accessibility standards)
- The website should also be fully responsive design and comply with the Accessibility standard W3C WCAG (AA standard).
- It is anticipated that the website and its 3 discrete sections will have a total of approx 13 pages of content.
